

Managing Committee's Report

On behalf of the managing committee it gives me great pleasure to present the Annual Report for the year 2008-09. The year that signaled a shift in gears in many ways – preparing for the Diamond Jubilee of the association and gearing up for the school's 150 years celebration 2013.

As we have received this year's SSC results, we are glad to state that year ending March 2009 the school achieved excellent performance with 92 Distinctions, 95 First Class, 32 Second Class, 7 Pass class and only 3 failures and the highest percentage of 96% by Pranav Deshpande.

The committee has been extremely active and has laid emphasis on putting in place some of the building blocks for these two big events. The committee now meets once a month on the second Friday of each month, as well as additional meetings for projects as and when required. Between July' 08 and March'09 a total of 9 scheduled meetings took place, 1 brainstorm session and 2 reunion meetings. All meetings had quorum and was well attended with over 75% attendance by members.

Over the year 47 new members have joined the St Stanislaus Ex Student Association.

As you may have noticed that the Alumni website is now being constantly updated and improved, it has definitely become the focal point of all communications and members are requested to log onto the site more often. This year onwards we hope to post all notices on the website with the intention of being eco-friendly, **saving costs** as well ease the coordination requirements.

St. Stanislaus Ex-students Association is one of the few alumni organizations around the world that can boast of celebrating its diamond Jubilee. Our annual Reunion, "Bond of Boys" 2010 will be held over two days on the 9th and 10th January 2010. The focus is to become 1. A vibrant organization that will attract and encourage alumni across age groups, social standing and religion to become members of SSES and contribute to their Alma Mater 2. To help their school maintain its high standards and values of the school thereby retaining its position as a leading educational institute in the city.

The annual picnic to Lonavla was successfully conducted on 29th to 31st May 2008 at the St. Stanislaus Villa. A total of 50 Stanislites along with their families attended the picnic. Thanks to Melville Rodricks and his team of volunteers for organizing the picnic.

114 Staff members covered under the Staff Healthcare Scheme

The premium of Rs 3.99 lakhs for this year's (2008-09) medical insurance covering the hospitalization expenses for the school staff (current and retired) and school workers has been collected and paid. In addition, seventeen school workers have also been covered under a personal accident insurance. 114 serving and retired staff were covered. Thanks to alumni Mahavir Chopra whose company Bonsai International negotiated a good deal in difficult circumstances. For the second year Bonsai International has not charged their fee for which we are grateful. Mr John Lohale (Marathi) at 89 is the oldest retired teacher to be covered. A total of 44 retired teachers and retired staff were covered this year.

Stanislaus Alumni vs St Mary's Alumni Football match

On the 15th of August 2008 the 2 teams played against each other reliving the erstwhile competitive spirit between the 2 great Jesuit institutions. It lived up to the expectations of fun and competition that exists between the 2 schools – this was followed up with a lunch and refreshments.

JAAI West Zone Congress - Ahmedabad

“Many Sparks, One Fire – A Fire that kindles other fires”

The West Zone Congress of the Federation of Jesuit Alumni Associations of India (JAAI) serves as a platform to meet, collaborate and strategise with other Jesuit Alumni Associations in the West Zone.

The Congress was held in Ahmedabad, Gujarat between October 1st and 2nd 2008 on the campuses of Loyola Hall and St. Xavier's College, Ahmedabad. 227 delegates including 27 priests attended the Congress. Fifteen delegates from SSESA participated in the congress.

Stanislite, Fr. Francis de Melo SJ, former Provincial of Bombay Province gave the keynote address in which he emphasized the skills set required for today's fast growing India and how Jesuit schools needed to re-invent themselves. Fr. de Melo felt preparing students for today's globalized world called for intense creativity and the key was collaboration among Jesuit Schools and with Alumni.

University of California, Irvine Consulting Project for SSES

The students of the Paul Merange School of Business, University of California, Irvine completed a consulting project for SSES. As part of their project to gain consulting experience with a real organization/team and put their knowledge of organizational behavior into practice. They conducted telephone interviews, online surveys and online survey follow-ups. They investigated the motivation of alumni or lack thereof and the challenges they face to contribute to the initiatives of the organization. Their report provide possible solutions to the existing challenges faced by alumni at large so as to increase the participation rate and in turn address the interests of the alumni, the school and the organization

Aptitude Test

The Aptitude testing and Career counseling for of our Class IX students was conducted by Mr RL Karandikar, President – Maharashtra Shikshan Vyavsay Margadarshan Sanghatana and his experienced team from Broadway Career Counseling Academy. On January 31, 2009 Mr Karandikar spoke on the importance of the Aptitude Tests for helping our children decide on their future career. The test were held on February 1st, 2009. Each boy along with his parents attended individual counselling on February 22nd 2009. A total of 187 boys were tested counseled.

First Aid awareness program:

SSES's First Aid Awareness Course for the Teachers of St. Stanislaus High School was held on Tuesday 16th October 2008 at the AV Room in the School. It had a very positive response from the teachers. Lasting almost two hours, the event was conducted by pediatric surgeon Dr. Bhalchandra Jayakar (Batch of 1987). His wife, Dr. Priti, a laproscopic surgeon also accompanied him. The extensive presentation covered a wide-range of issues from cuts, burns, fractures to dog bites, drowning and electric shocks

The students of Std VIII had a First Aid awareness cum training program on 12th November 2008 in the School AV room. The aim of the program was to equip the boys with knowledge and techniques while dealing with an emergency before professional help arrived. Besides the boys the school Sports Director and a few school workers also attended the session.
